## **Practice of the Presence of God**

Blessed are those who have learned to acclaim you, who walk in the light of your presence, LORD.

## **Practicing the Presence of God**

- Go on a 'God hunt,' looking for evidence of God's presence throughout your day in the people you encounter, in moments of beauty in nature, etc.
